We provide schools and youth programs with college and career preparation workshops, workbooks, advising for upperclassmen students, and standards-based college and career video curriculum on a digital learning platform.

   250 youth served annually.

- Minority youth 98% of students are students of color.
- Geographic Region 100% of students attend Northwest and West Jacksonville Title I schools.

# 10 REASONS WHY OUR JACKSONVILLE TEENS NEED THE COLLEGE AND CAREER DREAMS PROGRAM



Did you know

#### 8 Million

Students in the United States do not have access to a school counselor?

That's 1 in 5 students without support to plan out their future





Zeroing in on demographics, low Income students and students of color are affected the most by the lack of counselors as they were reported by the American School Counselor Association (ASCA) to have identified their school counselor as the person who had the most influence on their thinking about post secondary education





This problem is prevalent in our backyard of Jacksonville, Florida. There are **30,246** high school students in Duval County Public Schools and only **115** high school counselors.

ASCA shows a strong correlation with smaller school counselor to student ratios to the following outcomes



Improved Attendance



Fewer discipline issues



Higher graduation rates

Bottom Line: The more college and career support the greater the odds of a student graduating, earning a degree, and attaining a relevant job to take care of themselves and their family.






The Center for Education and the Workforce links a high school diploma with 20% of US Jobs paying \$35,000. If students are prepared for college and attain a bachelors degree 56% of US jobs will pay them \$35,000 or higher.



Unfortunately, generational cycles of poverty still exist especially amongst students of color in Northwest and West Jacksonville. Research has shown that poverty has a negative domino effect on communities such as increased crime and poor physical and mental health





The College and Career Dreams Program is a college and career preparation program that exists to be a part of the solution to break generational cycles of poverty in the Northwest and West Jax region by teaching youth to believe it possible to achieve their college and career dreams, no matter their background. As students increase their educational attainment their opportunities for a better quality of life increase as well. Through our services we believe Jacksonville will have a healthier future, one youth at a time.

## OUR R-E-D FORMULA FOR IMPACT

We use the College and Career R-E-D formula for impact which defines specific strategies to increase student outcomes in three priority outcome areas:

Academic Readiness, Social-Emotional Empowerment, and Individual Determination



#### READINESS: SKILLS AND INFORMATION

We prepare students with mneumonic mindset strategies to extract knowledge and adopt any skill that is necessary to meet benchmarks on standardized test such as FSA, college entrance exams such as the ACT and SAT, and grade level course work required for promotion and high school graduation.



## **GRADUATION RATES**




Seniors who graduated with a standard diploma

100% of the College and Career Dreams seniors graduated with least a standard diploma compared with the comparison group, which had 81.9 percent of its seniors graduate with at least a standard diploma.



# FLORIDA STANDARDS ASSESSMENT READING PERFORMANCE









Amongst more than 180,000 students tested, the average yearly growth on the FSA is approximately 6 points. At a 5 point difference, our students had close to more than one year more growth than the comparison group within the same school who started in the same achievement level.

#### **Reading Proficiency**








On average, students who were enrolled in the CCD program (974.02) had statistically significantly higher (p=0.03) Lexile reading scores than the comparison group (864.53). This difference equates to the CCD students being more than a year ahead of the comparison group in terms of their reading abilities. The difference also demonstrates that CCD students are closer to reaching the work-place readiness range growth outline in the Lexile Measure graphic.



## **COLLEGE READINESS ASSESSMENTS**





According to an ACT Policy and Research report by Dr. Jill Crouse, students who retake the ACT have a higher probability of achieving a higher score. The higher a student scores the more opportunities for college acceptance and scholarships. Longitudinal ACT data trends show that lower-income students tend to retake test less than higher-income students. Our student retake percentage is higher for both the SAT and ACT Test.





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## MY BELIEF IN MY ABILITY TO GO TO COLLEGE IS


